On 30th June, we celebrated the retirement of two remarkable members of St. Patrick's College, Mr Paul Lowe and Mrs Christina Harkins.

We said slán go fóill to our longest serving male teacher, Mr Paul Lowe after 31 years in St Patrick's.

Mr Lowe joined the staff of St Patrick's in September 1995, taking over as Head of Business Studies in 1998. A few years later, Mr Lowe was appointed as Head of Sixth Form and more recently Head of ICT in 2023.

Mr Lowe played a big part in the extracurricular aspects of school life,

particularly managing the Gaelic football teams for many years.

Mrs Christina Harkins, our Assistant Principal, is retiring after 21 years at St Patrick's, having previously taught in Yorkshire and in Bangor, Co Down.

Mrs Harkins has held many posts of responsibility over the past 21 years including Year 12 Tutor, SEN Co-ordinator and Head of Teaching and Learning. She took on the role of Pastoral Care Co-ordinator in the mid-2010s; a role she has continued to fulfil to this day. Her most demanding role came when she was appointed Assistant Principal in 2013.

We thank Mr Lowe and Mrs Harkins for their outstanding service and wish them both a very rewarding and enjoyable, well-earned retirement.

Activate Your Curiosity: Making Sense of Science

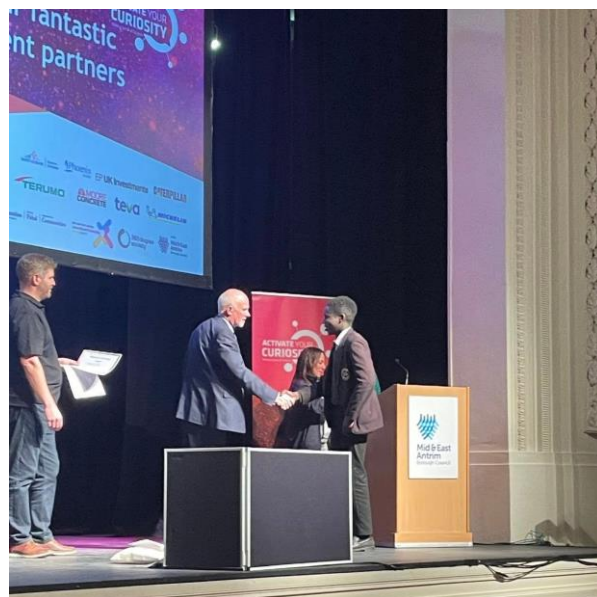
A group of students from 10 Foyle attended the annual Activate Your Curiosity: Making Sense of Science event at The Braid Arts Centre.



The students listened to a small talk from representatives from a global data storage company, Seagate Technology. The students then completed a task using Virtual Reality technology. They listened to a TED talk from Professor Dimitrios Lamprou on the health benefits of cacao and how this natural food source can have a positive impact on diet and medicine. They received another TED talk from conservation biologist, Dr Neil Reid on the importance of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics) for helping to discover new species and to protect our environment and existing rare animals. Phoenix Gas provided interesting talks and tasks, again highlighting the importance of STEAM for providing their service.

Finally, the students took part in a live auditorium chat with Formula 4 racing driver Rowan Campbell-Pilling who was speaking from the pit lane at the Abu Dhabi race circuit. Rowan gave an insight into the importance of STEAM

with the preparations of his car, running the team and the wide range of jobs available in motorsport with STEAM backgrounds.



Our students were brilliant throughout but the highlight of the day was when our own student, Peter Kato, was awarded the Seagate Technology prize for the best use of Technology at the event. Congratulations, Peter and well done to all our students who took part!

St Brigid's Day

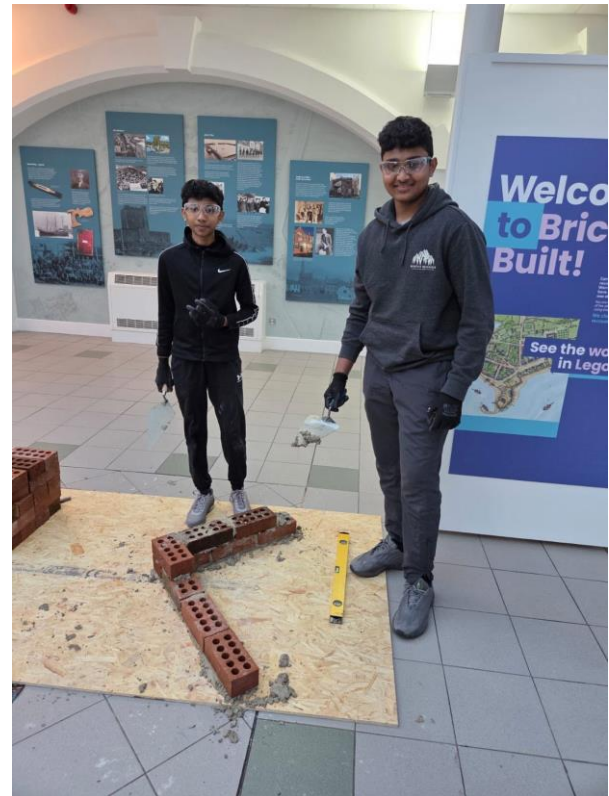
